# BIGM

The institute currently offers Masters in Public Affairs (MPA) in Governance and Public Policy, International Economic Relations, and Human Resource Management. From January 2024, BIGM will offer Masters in Public Affairs (MPA) in another three subjects namely Project Management, Procurement & Supply Chain Management, and Public & Private Financial Management. The Board of Trustees and the Governing Body of BIGM include the leading policymakers in Bangladesh and eminent personalities with a broad spectrum of experience.

Under new leadership, BIGM is currently engaged in streamlining, broadening, and sharpening its operational focus to help Bangladesh navigate its rapid socio-economic transformations in an increasingly globalized and complex world.

To achieve that goal, BIGM management has set several core objectives which will determine how the Institute will function in the future. With this backdrop, BIGM is instituting a high-qum Policy Analysis of international standards.

# **Training Course on Policy Analysis**

For over a decade now, our growth has been over 6.25 percent, a feat unimaginable a few decades earlier and an outcome that also reflects the government's commitment and choices. Contrary to some popular narratives, the government's policies significantly shaped the quality of growth in Bangladesh. For example, the governments consistently supported cash transfer programs, encouraged the participation of Civil Society Organizations (CSOs), and designed pro-poor fiscal and monetary policies that touched the lives of those who needed the most. Happily, for us, Henry Kissinger's 'Bottomless Basket' prediction has been proven wrong, as has Kuznets' theory of rising inequality at the early stages of growth. Although our policies might not have been always holistic or wellcoordinated, they were always sincere and mostly consistent; these policies deserve a substantial part of the credit.

We all know Bangladesh is now at a crossroads of development. We are witnessing one of the largest manufacturing-led take-offs democracy. The economy is ready to reap the benefits of its comparative advantages, including our demographic dividend. For that, we need to transform our huge population into human capital. We need to upgrade the productivity of both skilled and unskilled workers; the capacity of both private and public-sector institutions. A competent bureaucracy is, therefore, a must for any sustained economic take-off. No sustained economic take-off has ever taken place without a competent bureaucracy. This is especially more so in a private sector-led growth process in a democracy. Needless to say, this constraint is also more binding during the middle-income transitions. The road to a developed Bangladesh by 2041 goes through a competent bureaucracy, as the experiences of East Asia and advanced economies have demonstrated.

We are heartened by the government's urgency in enhancing the skills of the people to maximize the population dividend and its benefit. Along with the general skills development program, the government has also prioritized the training of new cohorts of visionary bureaucrats with

knowledge and skills who can better design, implement, and evaluate the next generation of reforms in Bangladesh. The quality of our bureaucracy will critically influence the growth trajectory in the next phase of our development.

A mature private sector has rightly contributed to the developmental effort ever more than before. But during the middle-income transitions, being right may not be enough. An enabling environment for the bureaucracy is a necessary condition for sustained takeoff. An efficient bureaucracy with practical knowledge combined with an open, constructively critical approach that can address questions of governance and policy development is the need of the hour. Moreover, effective implementation is contingent on evidence-based policy formulation and evaluation, which are essentially an iterative process. Therefore, a dynamic, innovative, and thoughtful bureaucracy is a sin-qua-non for moving to the next higher plane.

It is the earnest hope of BIGM that the policy analysis training would provide a set of conceptual frameworks for analyzing public policy, and formulating effective strategies for policy design, analysis, evaluation, and advocacy. The concepts, skills and analytical tools students would learn in the training would rest upon a foundation of economic principles, institutional analysis, and political and social psychology. They would be able to identify, analyze, predict the patterns of behaviour and outcomes, and ultimately enhance policy effectiveness. That in turn would infuse dynamism, innovation, and critical reasoning into the bureaucracy responsive to the complex world we now live in. 2600 years ago, the Chinese philosopher Lao Tzu, said 'the journey of a thousand miles begins with one step'. We are taking that first step in an unprecedented journey for the 160 million Bangladeshis. We are embarking on that journey by carrying the inspirations and the sacrifices of the past. And with that resolve, pragmatism, and optimism, our top policymakers will train a new brand of trained human ware for a more just, more inclusive, and more developed Bangladesh.

# **Course Objectives**



This course is designed exactly to fulfill the above needs. It will familiarize the participants with several fundamental factors:

- a) the dynamics of the public policy-making process;
- b) the intricacies of group struggles or vested interest groups;
- c) the generic instruments of public policy;
- d) the roles of policy analysts in a democratic society; and
- e) in particular, the arts and science of dealing with the challenges of policy-making.

The main purpose of the course is to create enlightened policy managers/executives who will be reform-minded and risk-taking innovators and forward Bangladesh so that it can wade through the challenges of development and achieves its long-term vision. In addition, the program seeks to sharpen the basic skills in analytical thinking, information gathering, and report writing to better design, implement and influence policies. Therefore, to accomplish this main purpose, the specific objectives would be:

- a) To enable the trainees to have a clear understanding of the principal analytics, tools, and techniques of policy analysis;
- To prepare the trainees to better navigate the complex and dynamic process of policy formulation, implementation, monitoring, and evaluation;
- To make them understand the intricacies of group interaction of different players in the policy domain; and
- d) To be aware the trainees of the role of public policy analysis in a democratic society, in particular the arts and science of dealing with the challenges of policymaking.

This course is designed for those who are interested in joining or are already working in the government in various policy formulation, implementation, and evaluation capacities. It can also better equip those interested in constructively influencing policies, including



through the Development Partners, NGOs, advocacy groups, or think tanks. Participants are expected to gain an intimate knowledge of and build capacity in policy analysis and implementation to meaningfully contribute to Bangladesh's journey towards a more just, equal, and progressive society that our freedom martyrs sacrificed their lives for. In short, this training program/course in policy analysis should make trainees-

- ♦ Learn the language of policy formulation and
  - > to write with clarity, structure, and precision.
  - to use supporting documentation (maps, charts, data, graphs) effectively.
  - ➤ to develop simple models that are supported theoretically and empirically.
  - to evaluate the developmental as well as distributional aspects of policies and programs.
  - to incorporate socio-political factors into the analysis.
  - > to bring cross-country lessons into policy formulation.
- ♦ Develop analytic skills
  - quantitative and
  - qualitative
- ♦ Learn to
  - accommodate/adjust/advocate uncomfortable positions.
  - work under time constraints and allocate analytic resources.
  - Develop management skills and the ability to work in, and/or direct a team.

# Structure of the Policy Analysis Course

#### KEY ASPECTS OF THE POLICY ANALYSIS COURSE

#### **□** Course Duration:

The length of the Policy Analysis Course is Ten weeks (50 working days). Of which, six weeks (06) will be devoted to a classroom environment at BIGM. Later the trainees will be fully involved in the preparation of a draft policy paper under the supervision of an experienced mentor and co-mentor for 3 weeks. In the 10<sup>th</sup> week, each trainee will make their presentation before a panel of experts. The session is held on all weekdays (Saturday to Wednesday) except holidays; however, depending on the necessity, the session may be held on the weekend. Participation of the trainees in all activities is mandatory during training.

#### **■** Expected Participants

- ♦ Executives from public and private sectors and NGOs with a Master's degree from recognized universities and a minimum of 10 years of work experience demonstrating sound knowledge of laws, regulations, strategic planning, and policies in the 30 –52 age group.
- ♦ Of the participants, 70% will be from the public sector and 30% from NGOs and the private sector. At least 30% of the participants are expected to be female.

#### **■** Resource Persons/Trainers/Facilitators

Drawn from academia, universities, research institutes, government and private sectors, the judiciary, law enforcement, defense services, development partners, and the NGO sector.

#### **□** Class Size, Session, and Lecture Duration

The number of Participants per batch is 30. One and half hours per session. Maximum four sessions a day.

#### Quality Control

Training contents and learning materials will be updated regularly on feedback from trainees, trainers, and experts in relevant fields.

#### **■** Training Details and Instruction Format

- ♦ There will be nine (9) modules over ten weeks; with a maximum of four sessions per day. There will be a total of eighty (80) sessions for eight modules, approximately eight modules in 6 weeks and the 9<sup>th</sup> module (4 weeks) is for the preparation and presentation of a policy paper by the participants. Each module will contain roughly 8-12 lectures (on average 10).
- ♦ The morning session will begin at 9:00 am, with a 30-minute tea break between two sessions before lunch, and the afternoon session will start at 1:30 pm, with a 15-minute tea break between two sessions. Library and IT room attachment will be part of the training.
- ◆ Participants will receive Transportation Allowances (TAs) for attending the training days.
- ♦ The medium of instruction for the policy analysis course is English. The centre encourages the participants to develop their oral and written skills in English through practicing inside and outside the classroom. More importantly, all assignments (both group or individual) and presentations will be in English.

#### ■ Assessment of the Trainees

All the trainees are expected to prepare a draft policy paper individually which will be treated as the main basis of evaluation/assessment of their performance in the training program. There will be 3 (three) other short assignments, which will also be a part of the total assessment.

#### ■ Course Management Team (CMT)

The course management team comprises with Program Director, Deputy Program Director, Training Coordinator from BIGM, Officer (Finance), Officer (Administration), and other support staff of PIU. Each activity of the course is managed by the Program Director along with other members of CMT, and the whole work will be guided by the Director of BIGM. Participants are encouraged to share any feedback with CMT to ensure the quality of the training.

#### **■** Food/Meals

Meals are arranged for participants through the course management team. The participants will take their snacks, lunch, and afternoon tea within the scheduled time at the specified dining room/cafeteria. The CMT is responsible for maintaining the overall quality of meals served to the participants.

# **Quality Management**

#### a ) Training Management Committee (TMC)

A ten-member committee will be constituted and it will be chaired by the Senior Secretary/Secretary, Ministry of Public Administration to oversee the program and ensure training quality. Other members of the committee will be (1) Rector, BPATC (2) Rector, BCS (Admin) Academy (3) Representative of Cabinet Division (4) Representative of Finance Division (5) Representative of SEIP, Finance Division (6) Representative of BIDS (7) Representative of NAPD (8) Representative of BIGD, BRAC University and (9) Director BIGM will act as member secretary of the training management committee. The committee will meet at least once in a year. The committee may look after the following activities:

- a) Selection of trainees
- b) Selection of trainers
- c) Validation of Program contents
- d) Preview of learning materials
- e) Review and validation of Assessment mechanisms
- f) Guidance about placement in ministries/industries
- g) Graduation and awarding of the certificate
- h) Selection of trainees for further training abroad

#### b ) Project Standing Committee (PSC)

A **Project Implementation Unit (PIU)** will be set up, employing professionals to execute the program. The Project Standing Committee of BIGM will monitor and provide operational guidance to the PIU for implementing the program successfully. The committee will meet from time to time to monitor progress and address the challenges.

The Project Standing Committee will appoint a Program Director, Deputy Program Director, Officers, and other Support Staff for the PIU to oversee the program. The Program Director will be accountable and reportable to the Project Standing Committee.



The trainees will study the field and in consultation with the relevant ministries/industries and even with relevant private association/enterprise, they will undertake policy analysis on agreed issue (s) from scratch going through all the steps of ex-ante and ex-post evaluation. From the very beginning of the course and as the course will progress trainees will be asked to think and articulate the issue on which she/he is interested to write the Policy Draft Paper.

The trainees are expected to prepare <u>policy draft papers along with summary/policy briefs</u> which will be the main basis of their performance evaluation in the training program. This will be done under the guidance of mentor and co-mentor. Although trainees will remain under a close observation of the program management throughout the 10-week period. *The Paper will be evaluated on a grading scheme that means different weightages will be given on different parts of the Paper itself.* There will be a seminar and certificate awarding ceremony of the course where best participants will present their Draft Policy Papers individually before the guest and audience. The trainees' over-all performance will be evaluated as follows:


